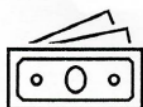

Did you know?

Lawns and gardens require only 5 millimetres of water per day during warm weather. Less is needed during spring, fall, or cool weather. Water lawns every three to five days, rather than for a short period every day. In warm weather, apply 5 millimetres of water for each day since the last watering.

- Water during the cool part of the day, in the morning or evening.
- Do not water on windy days.
- Do not over-water in anticipation of a shortage. Soil cannot store extra water.
- Use shut-off timers or on-off timers, if possible.
- Do not turn on sprinklers and leave for the day.
- Collecting and using rainwater can be a great way to save water.



Benefits of Collecting Rainwater

Cost Savings: By using rainwater for irrigation and other non-potable uses, you can significantly reduce your water bills.

Rainwater is naturally soft and contains fewer dissolved minerals compared to tap water, making it better for plants.

Environmental Impact: Harvesting rainwater helps reduce runoff and erosion, contributing to better water management in your area.

Drought Resilience: In regions experiencing drought, rainwater harvesting provides a reliable source of water for gardens and landscaping.
